Purpose of your role	To research, develop, evaluate, and assist in producing educational materials for schools, appropriate to the national curriculum and relevant to Trust sites; and to lead school groups visiting Trust sites.
Type of work you will be involved with:	<p>Research: When appropriate, researching and developing materials for site visits from schools. Drafting school materials in liaison with local schools, testing and evaluating materials and organising test site visits.</p> <p>Leading school visits: Assisting school visits by meeting groups on site and leading activities as set out in the Trust's Activities Plan and Schools' Planning document (see http://www.norfarchtrust.org.uk/schools-information)</p> <p>Working in schools: On occasions, liaising with school teachers to deliver in-school activities</p>
Skills & abilities you will be using in your role	<p>Good knowledge of school curriculum and teaching methods</p> <p>Experience of working with children</p> <p>Well-organised and self-motivated</p>
Training provision from NAT	Training provided either through funded projects; or individually working with Trust staff and existing volunteer teams as mentors.
Times/days we would like you to be available	<p>The school visiting season is mainly between May to late July, and September to late October each year.</p> <p>Currently we do not pre-set times for school visits, but respond on a first come, first served basis. Proposed dates will be circulated to volunteer teams to ascertain availability. Site visits may number between 5-10 per annum,</p>
You will be based at	Currently two sites invite active school visits: Burgh Castle Fort and Caistor Roman Town
