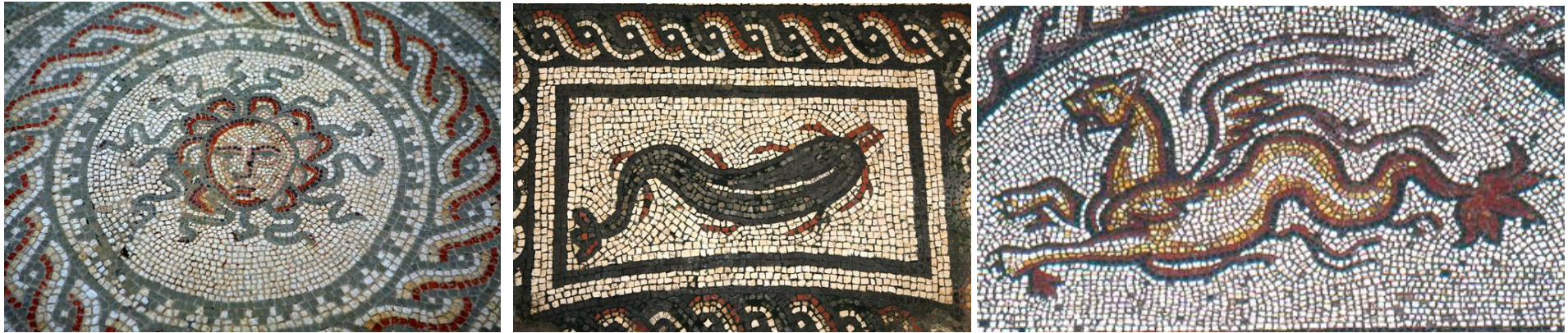


MOSAICS

Rich Romans liked to decorate their floors and walls with mosaics. A mosaic is a picture that is made up of small pieces of coloured stone called tesserae. More than 2,000 Roman mosaics have been discovered in Britain. Most of them are decorated with patterns and about 200 contain figures of animals or people.
